#### Jesse Berry, MD

Saturday, June 2, 10:07 am Innovations & Advances in Retinoblastoma Management

Dr. Jesse Berry is the associate director of ocular oncology at the USC Roski Eye Institute and Children's Hospital Los Angeles. In addition, Dr. Berry is associate residency program director

for the Los Angeles County and University of Southern California ophthalmology residency program.

She received her undergraduate and medical degree from Harvard University. Following her ophthalmology residency at the University of Southern California, she was the assistant chief of service at the Los Angeles County Medical Center. She then completed a fellowship in ocular oncology at Children's Hospital Los Angeles under the mentorship of Drs. Jonathan Kim and Linn Murphree. Dr. Berry is the founder of WOO, Women in Ocular Oncology. Her clinical expertise includes anterior segment, intraocular and external tumors. Her research endeavors focus on clinical outcomes of retinoblastoma and choroidal melanoma and use of the aqueous humor to develop of a surrogate tumor biopsy for retinoblastoma.



#### Albert Carlotti, MD, DDS

#### Thursday, May 31, 2 pm *Silicone Facial Implants Workshop*

Albert Carlotti, MD, DDS is a board certified maxillofacial surgeon, fellow of the American Academy of Cosmetic Surgery and is pastpresident of board of directors of the Cosmetic Surgery Foundation. Dr. Carlotti attended UT

Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, Texas, completed his residency and fellowship in facial and body cosmetic surgery also at UT in Dallas, TX. He has practiced in Scottsdale, AZ for over 16 years with his wife, Dr. Michelle Cabret-Carlotti and the couple recently opened an additional office, Austin Cosmetic Surgery, in Lakeway, TX. Dr. Carlotti has dedicated his practice to facial and body cosmetic and reconstructive surgery since 2001 and has performed over 50,000 cosmetic and reconstructive procedures. He has lectured numerous times on the international level on facial and body cosmetic surgery and has educated surgeons at live surgery courses affiliated with the AACS. His primary mantra of practice is that "it is easier to maintain youth rather than to reacquire it" and the Carlottis work hard to generate naturally appearing results which stand the test of time without gimmicks or marketing schemes. Treating patients as if they were their own family members is the benchmark and hallmark for all that they do for others.
